## Planning a Trip?

Well, you'll also need to plan for bunny! Each bunny is unique and has its own personality and comfort level in its environment. When bunny moms and dads need to hit the road and taking bunny(ies) is not an option, they need to plan for who will take care of their buns. Some bunnies will do fine for a few days with a neighbor or friend looking in once a day. If it will be a longer trip, and friends and neighbors don't want to take on a longer commitment consideration should be given to pet sitter. There are people who are licensed and bonded and come to your house at times specified by you to feed, exercise, clean, interact and, if



necessary administer medication to your furry family member. Check with your veterinarian to see if they want to make a recommendation for a pet sitter. Some veterinary technicians do pet sitting as a way to supplement their income. Home pet sitting is less stressful on our critters because they have familiar surroundings and don't have to deal with transportation issues. The next best bunnysitting option would be to bring your baby to the home of an individual who boards pets. It is important to do your homework to ensure the individual you are entrusting your treasured friend is reliable and knowledgeable of your pet's needs. As we all know, rabbits have special needs and can get themselves into much mischief when left

unsupervised. A little extra checking and planning will pay off in peace of mind for you on your trip and a happy time for your buns.

Congratulations to Shannon and Mark who will be joining their hands and hearts

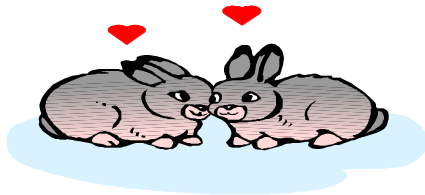
in marriage on April 22, 2000.

There are fifty (50) breeds recognized by ARBA American Rabbit Breeders Association.

There are no less than 24 coat colors and patterns.

Rabbits can weigh between 2 and 14 +pounds, depending on the breed.

Rabbits do not require bathing or inoculations against disease.

Rabbits are VERY affectionate; they express affection by licking and nuzzling close.

Rabbits require stimulation in the way of toys and other "Safe" things to catch their attention and keep them out of mischief.

**Female rabbits who are not spayed have a high probability of developing cancer.**

**Rabbits are most active during the morning and early evening hours.**

**A rabbit's digestive system is similar to that of a horse.**

**The best diet for a rabbit is an unlimited supply of timothy hay, rabbit pellets, fresh water and fresh greens.**
